




Multi-Agency Safeguarding Training Programme April 2026 – March 2027





Understanding Sexual Abuse

This course aims to help professionals understand the full effect of sexual abuse on children and the developing adult. It will also offer an opportunity to explore this very difficult, complicated, emotive, complex, sensitive area of child protection and will offer straightforward advice as to how to manage and cope with this difficult issue. Understanding the effects of child sexual abuse on child development and brain development will help the professional to cope with disclosures both verbal and non-verbal and help to understand the coping mechanisms and behaviour that the children develop as survival techniques.



Cultural competency and Humility Training

This **face-to-face** training is for partners working and volunteering with adults and children, this provides a great opportunity for people to share their experiences.

Training will cover :

- **Understanding culture both individually and within a wider social context.**
- **Understanding self, including cultural humility.**
- Becoming aware of our own cultural norms, attitudes, beliefs, and behaviours.
- To examine our own personal biases, stereotypes, and prejudices.
- Better understand what unconscious bias is and to reflect upon their own.
- Understanding what is meant by 'culture' and why it is important for health professionals to be aware of how this can impact health.
- Understanding the impact cultural differences might have on interactions with others.
- Become comfortable with "*not knowing*" – Balancing their expert knowledge with being open to learning from the community and people's lived experiences.

Allegations Management



Child Criminal Exploitation and County Lines Workshops





Cyber Safety Basics for Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults Online

In today's digitally connected world, cyber safety is an essential component of safeguarding practice, not merely a technical issue. Whether protecting children from online grooming and bullying, or shielding vulnerable adults from scams, coercion, and digital exploitation, understanding cyber safety is vital for anyone in a safeguarding role.

This session is designed to equip professionals, carers, and families with the foundational knowledge needed to identify and respond to digital risks early—before they escalate into safeguarding emergencies. By recognising the signs of technology-facilitated harm, practitioners can take proactive steps to reduce opportunities for abusers to target children and adults at risk and create safer online environments for those they support.


