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The research

Mixed methods NIHR-funded study (2023-2025) in Tower Hamlets and Bradford examining the role of community food organisations (CFOs) in reducing the need for emergency food assistance, focusing on the experiences of families.





Methodology

March 2023-October 2025
Bradford and Tower Hamlets, London

WP1 - Mapping of local food aid systems (what help is available where and what are the components)

WP2 - Longitudinal qualitative research

- Embedded research in 9 settings for 12 months
- 3 waves of interviews with food insecure families who are using (30) or not using (10) CFOs + sharing photos



Some key findings

- Many families use community food organisations (CFOs) regularly, as a way to manage persistently low incomes.
- Food insecurity is more often linked to complex interconnected issues (e.g. health, care responsibilities, barriers to access secure and better paid jobs) rather than short term crisis





Some key findings

Families value:

- food that is good quality, good value and includes fresh products
- friendly, welcoming, safe, confidential access to food support
- enough time and a suitable space to talk to a staff member (suitably trained)
- if support beyond food is promised, then it's followed up
- CFOs as a social space, which helps breaking down isolation





CFO recommendations - based on observations of good practice:

- Opportunities for food choice
- Consistent fruit and vegetables
- Meet dietary and cultural needs
- Consider cooking facilities
- Create welcoming and private spaces
- Regular training, including on subconscious bias
- Strategies to remove language barriers
- Invite users to become volunteers
- Partner or signpost to other agencies
- All staff familiar with eligibility processes
- Safeguarding and GDPR training
- Session de-briefs





Building up of toolkit

We will produce an 'Actionable Toolkit' written for local authorities, national government and CFOs aimed at reducing the need for emergency food in families with children.


